**Comprehensive Continuing Education.** Your best opportunity for continuing education in 2012 will be offered February 7 & 8 by OHEA at the new Oklahoma Weatherization Training Center in Edmond. The Comprehensive Continuing Education program provides 10 hours of credit toward renewal of your status as a Certified Homebuyer Education Professional. The program starts at 10:00 the first day and ends by 3:30 the second day to allow extra time for driving and minimize lodging expenses. Register early and we will incorporate your discussion topics. **Housing Data.** Here are data on education and housing in Oklahoma that you can use as a frame of reference when listening to news on the national housing market.

- Reported attendance of 1,085 at homebuyer workshops through the third quarter of 2011 is a sharp decrease from average annual attendance of 2,100.
- Homes sales in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter of 2011 were 23% higher than in 2010. Median cost was down 1.7% from \$111,702 in 2010 to \$109,791 in 2011. Average cost was down 4% from \$158,356 to \$151,497. (Source: Oklahoma Association of Realtors)
- 14.4% of Oklahoma mortgages were 30 days or more delinquent in the third quarter of 2011. That's up from 13.9% in the second quarter. (Source: Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City)

**HUD Loss Mitigation Training.** FHA's National Servicing Center has announced dates for this year's offerings of free courses in loss mitigation for mortgagees and nonprofit housing counselors.
